What to wear

Playground safety starts with your clothes and shoes.

Avoid clothes that have long strings that could get caught on slides or other equipments.



Always wear closed-toe shoes, and make sure to tie your shoelaces if they become untied.



Trusted adults

A trusted adult is a grown-up that can help you use equipment the right way.

You can ask for help
when you get scared
so that you can feel safe.
Listen carefully to adults.





Using equipment properly

Playground equipment is fun, but it can also be dangerous if not used correctly.

Always remember to:

Sit down before going down the slide.
Make sure your feet go first.

Hold onto the handrails when
climbing up and down the equipment.





Safety first

Be aware of your surroundings to avoid accidents. Be sure to watch where you are going to avoid running into others or onto the equipment.

1. Use walking feet on the equipment.
2. You can use running feet on the green top.
3. Hold onto the handrails when going up and down the equipment.
4. Sit down and make sure your feet go first when going down the slide.
5. Play safely and take turns on the equipment, one friend at a time.

- ★ Be safe with the equipment
- ★ Play nicely, keeping hands and feet to yourself
- ★ Take turns, one friend at a time

- Take turns on the equipment, one friend at a time
- Wait patiently for your turn in line
- Avoid pushing or shoving, keeping hands and feet to ourselves

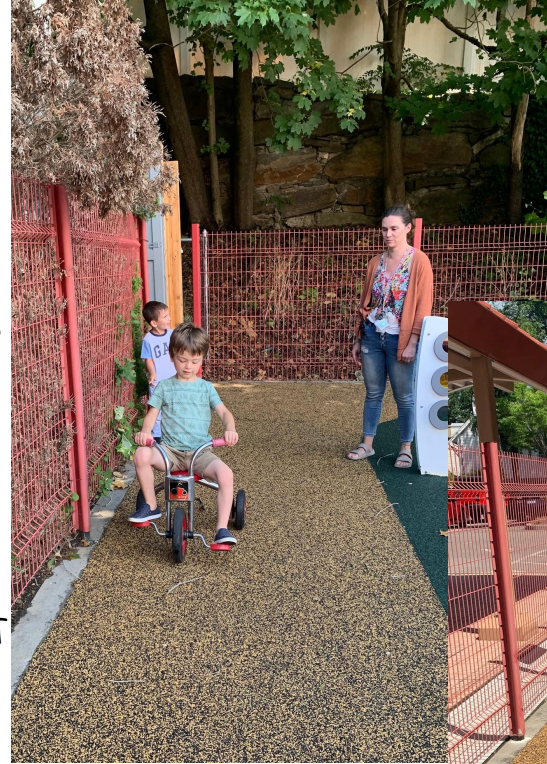


Bike safety

It is important to be safe and follow the rules when riding bicycles

Remember to:

- ★ Always follow the yellow path
- ★ Be aware of your surroundings and make sure that nobody is on the path
- ★ Keep both hands on the bike's handlebars
- ★ Only one person rides a bike at a time, and waiting patiently for a turn.

- Running up and down the stairs
- Being unsafe
